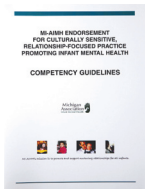

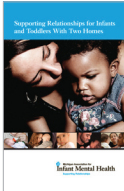
Guidelines For Comprehensive Assessment of Infants and Their Parents In The Child Welfare System

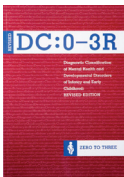
Supporting Relationships for Infants and Toddlers with Two Homes
